Introduction

Micah's prophecy begins in Samaria and Jerusalem presenting God's case against the nations of Israel and Judah.

Micah delivered the first of two series of judgments against Israel & Judah.



CONTEXT



Israel allowed the worship of idols and other gods to take root in their religious practices. Pagan practices became a part of Israel's worship to Yahweh. We see this today in part.

PERSONS, PLACES & EVENTS

1). Micah- a prophet from Moresheth, a small town in southwest Judah. He is sixth in the order of minor prophets; Micah also foretold of Christ's birth in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2; Matthew 2:6).

PERSONS, PLACES & EVENTS

Today we study the Prophet Micah in God's indictment on Israel. While also reminding Israel of Gods expectation.

**“And what does the LORD require of you?
To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God” (Micah 6:8).**

Questions To Consider

The text begins with a question (v.3) followed by list of actions God provided in favor of Israel to move them to repent. What does this Tell us about GOD's LOVE??
