Points of Information – Psalms

The Greek word “psalmoi” means “songs,” from which the terms “psalms” and “Psalter” come.

The Book of Psalms is actually a collection of Hebrew poetry, divided into five books.

Points of Information – Psalms

David wrote almost half (73) of the 150 Psalms. Other authors include Solomon, Asaph, Moses, the sons of Korah and possibly Ezra (as an author or editor). Approximately 48 Psalms are anonymous.

Points of Information – Psalms

The Book of Psalms covers approximately a thousand-year period, from the time of Moses to the post-exilic era.

There are multiple categories of Psalms: praise (thanksgiving), wisdom (didactic/instructional), penitential (repentance), lament (individual or communal), imprecatory (requesting punishment on enemies), enthronement and more.

This Psalm is not attributed to any specific author. Its points are made anonymously yet clearly – for us.

The LORD reigns, He is robed in majesty; the LORD is robed in majesty and armed with strength; indeed, the world is established, firm and secure.

Your Throne was established long ago;
You are from all eternity.
