PHILEMON INTRODUCTION

- 1). Written to Philemon, by Paul while imprisoned in Rome.
- 2). The shortest and most personal of Paul's Letters.
- 3). Subject, Onesimus, a runaway slave of Philemon, who apparently stole money (V.18)

PHILEMON 1:8 NRSV

⁸ For this reason, though I am more than bold enough in Christ to command you to do the right thing, 9 yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus.

PHILEMON 1:10-11 NRSV

¹⁰ I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. ¹¹ Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.

PHILEMON 1:12-13 NRSV

- ¹² I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you.
- ¹³ I wanted to keep him with me so that he might minister to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel,

- 1). Paul identifies Himself as Prisoner of Christ and an older now, what tone has this set?
- 2). Onesimus is in the middle, what is his challenge?
- 3). How do you think Philemon feel?

PHILEMON 1:14 NRSV

¹⁴ but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. 15 Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back for the long term,

KEY POINTS TO REMEMBER

- 1). Paul appeals on behalf of Philemon humbly in the spirit of Christian Love.
- 2). Paul validates the change in Onesimus, expecting his word to be of value & accepted by Philemon.
- 3). Philemon has been robbed, but is charged to forgive in Christian & Brotherly Love.

PHILEMON 1:16 NRSV

¹⁶ no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

PHILEMON 1:17-18 NRSV

¹⁷ So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me.

¹⁸ If he has wronged you in any way or owes you anything, charge that to me.

PHILEMON 1:19 NRSV

¹⁹ I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self.

PHILEMON 1: 20-21 NRSV

²⁰ Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. ²¹ Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I ask.

PHILEMON 1:22 NRSV

²² One thing more: prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping through your prayers to be restored to you.

KEY POINTS TO REMEMBER

JESUS IS LIGHT LOVE. INTEGRITY. GRACE. HUMILITY. TRUTH.
