LESSON INTRODUCTION



This Psalm of David is considered one of the most powerful Psalms of praise in the Bible.



This writing comes from the fourth book of Psalms which includes Psalms (90–106)



Psalms 103 is a command to worship, a reminder of God's Grace, mercy and divine love.

LESSON CONTEXT

David's tone in this writing indicates it was penned in the latter years of the king's life.

Perhaps after the crisis from which he had been delivered.

From beginning to end, this Psalm highlights the goodness of God and His unfailing Love.

PSALMS 103:1-3 NRSV

- 1. Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name.
- Bless the LORD, O my soul, and do not forget all his benefits,
- ³ who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases.

PSALMS 103: 7-8 NRSV Q

⁷ He made known his ways to Moses, his acts to the people of Israel.

⁸ The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

PSALMS 103: 9-10 NRSV @

⁹ He will not always accuse, nor will he keep his anger forever.

¹⁰ He does not deal with us according to our sins nor repay us according to our iniquities.

PSALMS 103:11-12 NRSV

11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him;

¹² as far as the east is from the west, so far, he removes our transgressions from us.

KEY POINTS TO REMEMBER **

- 3. The LORD is merciful and gracious IN SPITE OF!!
- 4. We cannot measure God, he is Infinite!

PSALMS 103:13-14 NRSV ***

- 13 As a father has compassion for his children, so, the LORD has compassion for those who fear him.
- ¹⁴ For he knows how we were made; he remembers that we are dust.
