LESSON CONTEXT

Psalm 145, is identified as an acrostic poem. Meaning each line, verse, or section starts with a word that begins with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet, which has 22 letters. NOTE: Psalm 145 has only 21 verses.

LESSON CONTEXT

The difference is reported to be in the ancient manuscripts. Psalm 145:13 lacks a line that would have included the absent letter. This was noticed in antiquity, and the ancient Greek translation of the Bible, known as the Septuagint.

Acrostic poems in the Bible

- Psalms: Psalms 25, 34, 37, 111, 119, and 145 are all acrostic poems. Psalm 37 is an acrostic Psalm
- Proverbs: Proverbs 31:10–31 is an acrostic poem that describes a virtuous woman.
- Lamentations: Lamentations 1–4 are acrostic poems.
