Introduction

A Seeker's Inquiry

1. A sincere desire motivated by an unclear understanding.

2. The attempt to gain access to eternal life by performing a human action.

LESSON CONTEXT

The first part of the lesson introduces Jesus' encounter with an unnamed young man whom we refer to as "the rich young ruler." A well-established figure in the community.

LESSON CONTEXT

The encounter occurred only a few weeks before Jesus 'crucifixion and resurrection. At the time there were several tense encounters with Pharisees and others, as Jesus taught in Galilee and left for Judea.

Matthew 19:16 NIV

¹⁶ Just then a man came up to Jesus and asked, "Teacher, what good thing must I do to get eternal life?"

Matthew 19:17 NIV

¹⁷ "Why do you ask me about what is good?" Jesus replied. "There is only One who is good. If you want to enter life, keep the commandments."

Matthew 19:18 NIV ¹⁸ "Which ones?" he inquired. Jesus replied, "You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony,

¹⁹ honor your father and mother,' and 'love your neighbor as yourself.' 20 "All these I have kept," the young man said. "What do I still lack?"

Matthew 19:20-21 NIV ²¹ Jesus answered, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."
